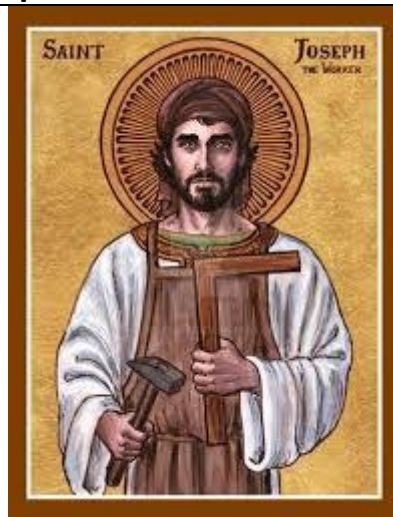

Saint of the day

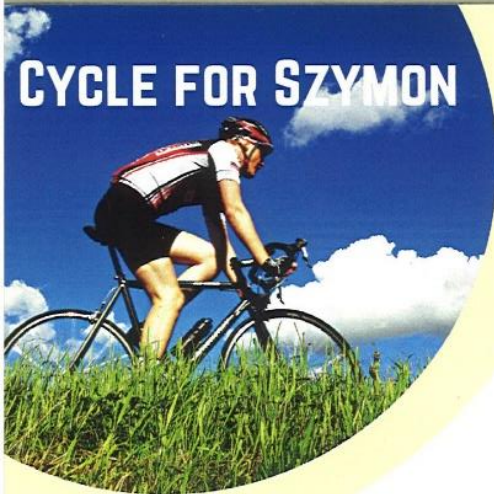
St Christopher Magallanes & companions

Szymon was born into the Plata family in March 2020 with Down Syndrome. Michal, Szymon's godfather was inspired to take up this challenge to raise awareness around all those special children and adults with extra chromosomes.

To raise awareness of inclusion and educational provision Michal Piecyk, a volunteer worker at The Good Shepherd Centre in Keighley will cycle the gruelling Great North 500 circuit round the North Coast of Scotland at the end of May.

Ewelina Jankowska as a part of her special study from her degree qualifications will study modern methods of support for Down's Syndrome Children.

Festivals and special days

Sunday is: Pentecost

Pentecost is often seen as the 'birthday' of the Church, since this is when the disciples of Jesus first proclaimed the Gospel after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit. The name comes from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth". The alternative name of Whitsuntide comes from the custom of converts presenting themselves for baptism on this day dressed in white. The symbols of Pentecost are those of the Holy Spirit and include the dove, the wind, the breath of God and flames.

The obligation to hear Mass at church on a Sunday is temporarily suspended although most churches are open for public Mass. Think about making use of a weekday Mass or hearing Mass online. It is usually necessary to book a place in order to attend Mass in a covid-safe manner. Checkout the parish websites:

The Mass will not go over one hour in length and tends to be around 45 minutes. Anyone who wishes to hear Mass in this way, for the cost of a local call, can access it by dialling 01642 130 120.
