Virtue of the Week – LOVE OF NEIGHBOUR



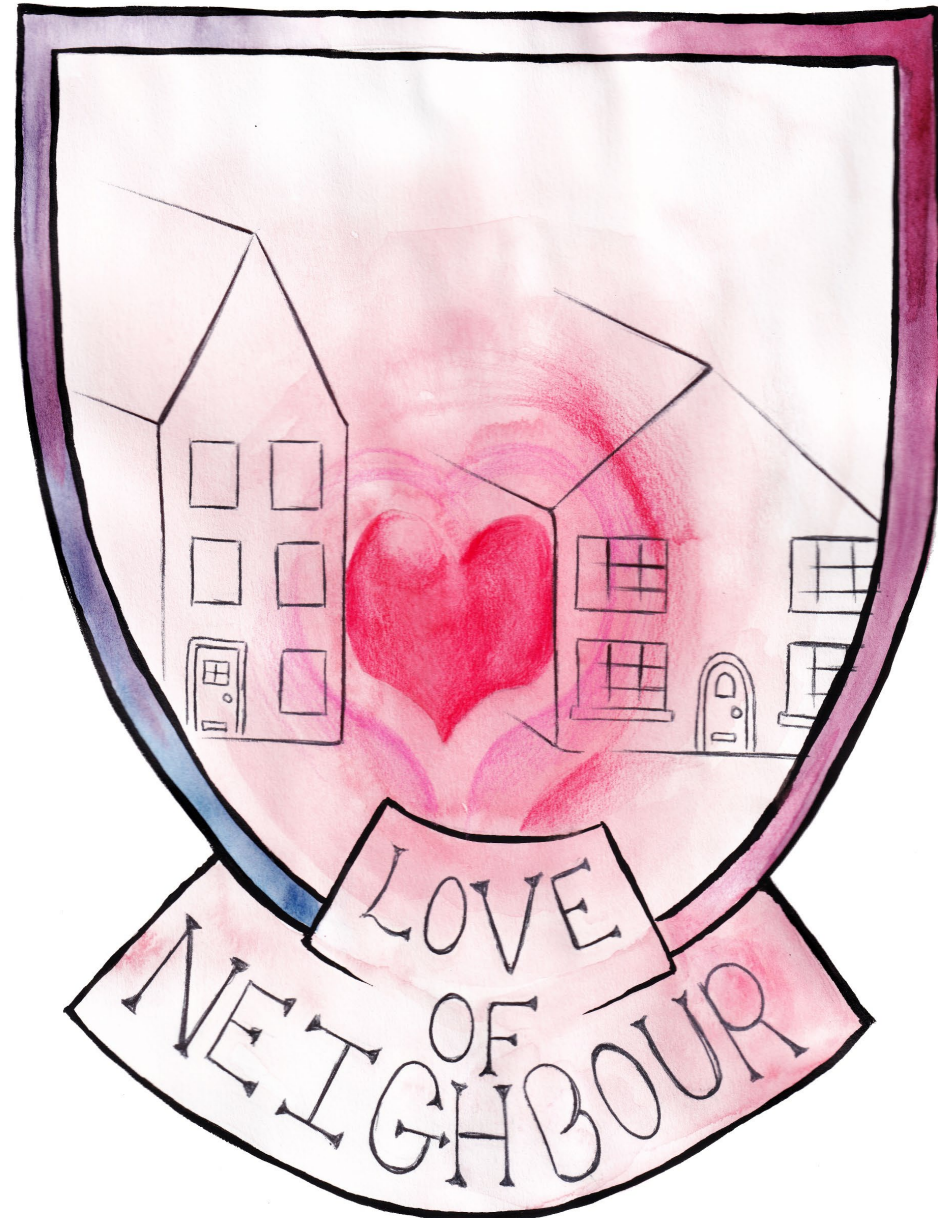
