## What is needed to master the knowledge?

Lessons 1 & 2 British Values – I understand what being British means to me. I understand what the British Values are. I understand how all people in Britain need to work together to help the country run smoothly.

Lesson 3 & 4 Knife Crime- I know the risks associated with carrying a knife. I understand the impact carrying a knife has on family and friends. I would never resort to carrying a knife under any circumstance.

Lesson 5 Knife free/Role models - To be able to describe how people learn what is appropriate from others actions. To evaluate the benefits of having a positive role model and the challenges of having a negative role model. To explain the value in behaving as a strong role model

Lesson 6 Serious and Organised Crime – To explain the reasons why some people might get involved in serious and organised crime. Describe the farreaching consequences of getting involved in serious and organised crime. Explain the factors and strategies that can help people avoid, or get out of, serious and organised crime. Describe positive ways in which young people can make the most of their skills and abilities.
